

#### MODERNISM & BAUHAUS

#### The new Weimar

Even before the founding of the State Bauhaus, Weimar stood for new possibilities: At the beginning of the 20th century, a creative climate for modern ideas unfolded. With the founding of the Bauhaus, it became revolutionary - and more fun. In an almost familylike atmosphere, the European avant-garde made great art and design history here.

#### Classics on foot

Where did Johann Wolfgang von Goethe live and where did the rebellious Schiller write? The poets' residences are less than five minutes away from each other. The Herzogin Anna Amalia Library is just as close by - a magnificent palace for books. Not far away, on Herderplatz, the City Church St. Peter and Paul bears witness to Bach, Cranach and the Reformation.

## Into the green

Spacious parks are Weimar's green gems: switch from the historic cobblestones to winding promenades and take a stroll where dukes and duchesses, court ladies and visionaries sought a refreshing break back in the day. The Park on the Ilm River is adjacent to the old town. For even more relaxation, we recommend outings to Belvedere, Tiefurt and Ettersburg, the former ducal summer residences.
